Due to limited digital access, it was not possible to carry out online activities. In the year we carried out activities on spreading awareness on vaccination among the communities. In the later part of the year focused on forming self-help groups of women with the easing of pandemic restrictions.

About Us

Saath Gramin Trust was initiated to cater to the needs of rural women and children regarding education, health, sustainable livelihoods, social and financial inclusion, and holistic development. Saath Gramin Trust is promoted by Saath Mahila Savings and Credit Cooperative Society.

The foundation primarily works in rural areas of Gujarat state and mainly focuses on the empowerment of youth and women.

Self-Help Group Women

With the pandemic restrictions being lifted during the end of the financial year, Saath Gramin Trust focused on forming Self-help groups (SHGs) and Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) of the rural women. SHGs and JLGs were formed with an aim to inculcate savings habit among the rural women.

In partnership with Saath Mahila Savings and Credit Cooperative Society, 50 SHGs and JLGs were formed with over 500 women joining as members. The women with support from Saath Mahila Cooperative will be provided access to savings and credit options for establishing their own micro-enterprises and other income generation activities.

The core objectives of Saath Gramin Trust are as follows:

1. Social and political empowerment
2. Focused and in-depth intervention on family income and education of children
3. Identify and work on gender and livelihood issues of women and promote entrepreneurship
4. Create alternative livelihoods for rural women and the community

Education and Development

Education remains one of the primary focus areas of Saath Gramin Trust. Our education initiatives focus on community-based education improvement, strengthening pre-primary education centers, skill development for adolescent girls, and income generation activities for women in eight villages of the Balva block of Ahmedabad district.

Throughout the year various awareness activities with children, youth, parents, and teachers are carried out. Vocational training is provided to adolescent girls and women of the community and are supported for setting up low-cost sanitary napkin enterprises.





COVID-19 Survey

Our project team went door to door in the village areas to spread awareness on the issue of COVID-19 pandemic and mobilised people for COVID-19 vaccination. One of the village women said, "Earlier we were very hesitant to take the vaccination, but after being counseled in detail about the benefit of the vaccination, I and my husband have taken the first dose from nearby government centre."
